



PROJECT CO-ORDINATOR

Salary: £24,000 - £31,500 (pro rata for 41 weeks a year, dependent on qualifications and experience) **Contract: Permanent job, working 10 months of the year** (off in the summer). This role averages 43 hours per week flexi time. There are four residential weeks away from home (69 hours per week), plus mostly afternoon and evening work. We will consider part time / job share applicants.

Location: Glasgow, with travel across the central belt of Scotland

Project duration: project year runs every year over 10 months, from August-June. You will join this year part way through in January 2022.

The Mark Scott Leadership for Life Award Programme

The Mark Scott Leadership for Life Award is a project of educational charity: The Outward Bound Trust. The Award is a youth volunteering award for students in the sixth year of secondary school. It begins with a five-day outdoor residential followed by a four-month community project. Participants design, plan, organise and deliver the community project, fundraising if necessary.

Job description

You'll make sure the award runs smoothly. You'll co-ordinate and communicate with participants, groups and schools, keeping them involved and informed. You'll prepare participants for their residential course and attend it with them, working alongside Outward Bound instructors to facilitate their learning. You'll then supervise their preparation, learning, planning and practical delivery of their community project.

Specific support for the Leadership for Life Groups in the central belt of Scotland includes:

- Delivery of residential programme at Outward Bound Loch Eil alongside their instuctors
- Weekly progress checks with group members, including 'out of hours' support
- Support of community project
- Preparation of required reporting
- Attendance at project team meetings
- Liaison with school champions
- School presentation to recruit young people
- Delivery of the Award ceremony

From April to June key tasks will include:

- Finalising all recruitment in schools
- Managing database upkeep and data entry
- Liaising with the team so all available places on the Award are filled.

Please note

- The successful applicant will need to be able to travel independently around the central belt of Scotland (ideally having your own car).
- You will need to provide two references (one from your last employer, one confirming your ability to work with young people). These will only be asked for once a job is offered.
- You'll also have to undertake a disclosure check with Disclosure Scotland at PVG level.
